The Queensland Government Food and Beverage Supplier Directory lists food and beverage suppliers who support Queensland jobs – the heart of our Buy Queensland approach.

The Directory aims to help grow our state's multibillion-dollar food and beverage industry and recognises caterers and businesses who are serving up the best deal for Queenslanders. To ensure that the Directory supports local growers and producers, and local products, membership of the directory is vetted by a group of industry experts.

Right now, Queensland Government buyers can access the Directory to browse food and beverage businesses and caterers and access their contact details. From August 2019, the Directory will be released to the public.

Growers and producers throughout Queensland not only contribute billions of dollars to our economy – they drive changes to customer needs, create healthier products and foster community integration.

The Queensland Government Food and Beverage Supplier Directory demonstrates our commitment to Queensland’s high-quality food and beverage businesses, by providing more support for food and beverage suppliers and supply chains to drive local employment.

How we will prioritise Queensland food and beverages

Queensland Government buyers will require event organisers to purchase locally grown and produced food and beverages wherever possible for events and functions that the Government supports. From August 2019, the public can also access the Directory.

We will prioritise Queensland food and beverages by:

- asking suppliers where they source their produce
- asking caterers and venues to provide more Queensland food and beverage options
- including requirements in our tender documents for Queensland food and beverages.
